There is lots of staff who work at the Zoo. The staff wear green shirts and can help me if I need it. The staff can also answer questions about the animals.



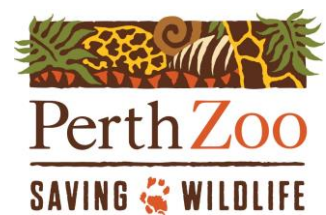
When I walk in, I can ask the Zoo staff for a map of the Zoo so I know where to find all of the animals.



The map also shows where the toilets are.

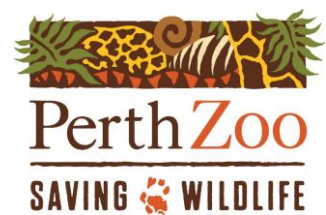


At the Zoo there are lots of animals.

Some animals don't like to be touched, so I can try to remember to ask the Zoo keeper before touching them.

When I go to the Zoo, I can walk around and see all of the animals.
The Zoo is very big so it's important to try and stay with the people who brought me to the Zoo.



Sometimes the Zoo can be busy or loud, but there are quiet places I can go.

I can ask the Zoo staff where the closest quiet area is.



When I'm at the zoo I might want to eat.

I can bring some food from home. There is also a cafe to buy food.



There is also a shop at the Zoo. I can go inside for a look. I might also buy something, but I don't have to.



When it's time to leave, I'll try to remember to take all of my things home with me.
